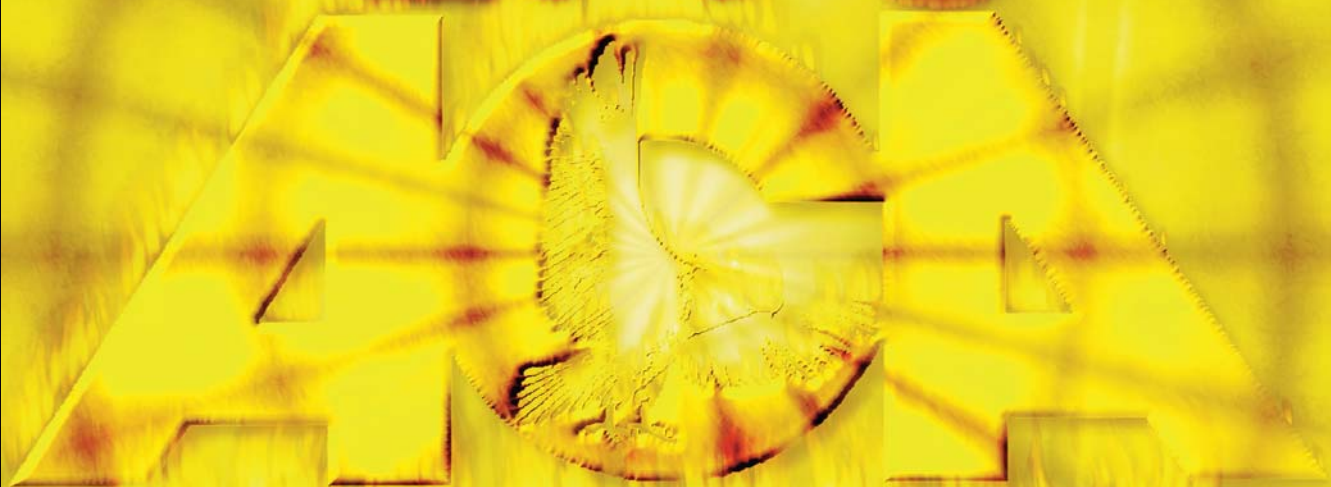

## COMPASSION IN INMATE'S FINAL DAYS

As of December 9, 2009, Unit 42 at the Mississippi State Penitentiary is the home of the newly dedicated Christopher B. Epps Compassionate and Palliative Care Unit.

Superintendent Kelly initiated the grand opening of the new facility with words of appreciation for Commissioner Epps for his service to the MDOC and to the state. He cited the commissioner's continuing push for the respectful and humane treatment of offenders as the key reason the new compassionate and palliative care unit is named in his honor.

Wexford Regional Manager, Lynda Powell addressed the purpose of the unit and the the fact that with the increasing age of the offender population and an increasing number of offenders sentenced to life, more offenders will be incarcerated during their final days.

The unit has visiting accomodations so family can be with their loved ones as they transcend. The visiting room is equipped with rocking chairs, peaceful paintings and reading materials. The entire environment departs as much as is reasonably possible from the standard institutional environment.

Commissioner Epps expressed his gratitude for the sentiment expressed in the naming of the Christopher B. Epps Compassionate and Palliative Care Unit.

Also celebrated was the generosity of the assistance with training which was provided by the Central Plains Geriatric Education Center from the University of Kansas Medical Center, the Louisiana-Mississippi Hospice and Palliative Care Organization, the National Hospice and Palliative Care Organization and Louisiana State Penitentiary-Angola.
